Simple Verb Tenses

The tense of a verb tells when the action takes place. Tense is often shown by endings (plays, played) and by helping verbs (will play, has played).



Past tense means the action happened before, or in the past.

- She jumped.
- They cheered.
- I walked.

Present tense means the action is happening right now or that it happens all the time.

- She jumps.
- They cheer.
- I walk.

Future tense means the action will take place later, or in the future.

- She will jump.
- They will cheer.
- I will walk.
