
meaning in the amendment. The gun rights group would not like the word *militia* to mean anything. The interpretation of this amendment takes on a different meaning when these two groups define those two words.

The courts have also said that the Second Amendment is not incorporated against the states. This means that the rights of this amendment are not extended to the individual citizens of the states. So a person has no right to complain about a Second Amendment violation by state laws. According to the courts, the Second mendment only provides the right of a state to keep an armed National Guard.
