- Three arguments. Choose three arguments you can use to convince your reader of your position. Briefly state these arguments here. 1-3 sentences

- Go back to paragraph one
- Find your first argument
- Write a paragraph about it
- Use specific examples to support your argument
- Write a transition sentence.

Paragraph 3 (5-8 sentences)

- Go back to paragraph one
- Find your first argument

- Use specific examples to support your argument
- Write a transition sentence.

Paragraph 2 (5-8 sentences)

- Go back to paragraph one
- Find your first argument
- Write a paragraph about it
- Use specific examples to support your argument

Conclusion (3-5 sentences)

- Summarize restate your thesis statement and three arguments in different words
- Make a closing statement. Tie your closing statement back to your opening hook.
