

The amendments, or additions, to the U.S. Constitution list the rights of the American people that cannot be taken away. Read the summary of each amendment below. - 1 People have the freedom of religion and the freedom of speech.
  - 2 People have the right to own guns and protect themselves.
  - 3 The government cannot force people to keep soldiers in their homes.
  - 4 People have the right to privacy in their homes.
  - 5 People accused of crimes have certain rights.
  - 6 People accused of crimes are to have fair trials.
  - 7 A person is guaranteed a trial by jury.
  - 8 People accused of a crime cannot be treated cruelly.
  - 9 People have many other rights not listed in the Constitution.
  - 10 States have powers not belonging to the national government.
  - 11 A citizen from one state cannot sue another state.
  - 12 The candidate with the greatest number of votes becomes president.
  - 13 Slavery is unlawful.
  - 14 All citizens have rights regardless of race.
  - 15 All male citizens have the right to vote regardless of race.
  - 16 The government has the right to collect taxes.
  - 17 People have the right to elect state senators.
  - 18 Alcoholic beverages are illegal.
  - 19 Women have the right to vote.
  - 20 A president's term in office begins at noon on January 20.
  - 21 Alcoholic beverages are legal.
  - 22 A president cannot serve more than two terms.
  - 23 Residents of Washington, DC, have the right to vote in a presidential election.
  - 24 A person cannot be denied the right to vote for failing to pay a tax.
  - 25 If the president becomes sick or dies, the vice president takes over.
  - 26 The voting age is changed from 21 to 18.
  - 27 Pay raises for members of Congress are delayed.
