

**Statewide Domestic Violence Intervention Strategies
Department of Human Services (DHS)**

Direct services to clients include:

- # Identification of domestic violence through:
Self disclosure by client, at a home visit, through participation in activities; Referrals from community partners or law enforcement; Questions on the Self Sufficiency Program and Oregon Health Plan Applications; Screening process/intake in all disciplines; Interview Questions; Local Tools or Safety Assessment forms; On-site domestic violence service providers/advocates or other partners, such as Mental Health or Substance Abuse Treatment providers who identify and make referrals for services; Adult protective services referrals, multi-disciplinary team referrals or child protective services referrals
- # Funds to help families escape and stay free from domestic violence through the *Temporary Assistance for Domestic Violence Survivors Program*
- # Referrals to services, joint case planning, and on-going coordination with local Domestic Violence Service Providers
- # Individualized and sometimes specialized case management for clients experiencing domestic violence
- # Service coordination with community partners through child abuse and elder abuse multi-disciplinary teams; law enforcement; participation on domestic violence councils; etc.
- # Information about resources and services (posters, pamphlets, brochures) is distributed in lobbies, at workers' desks, in restrooms, and/or through partner agencies
