<p>Attract</p> <p><i>"The pretty woman <b>attracts</b> many men."</i></p>	<p>+ive</p>	<p>Attractive</p> <p><i>"The pretty woman is <b>attractive</b> to many men"</i></p>
<p>Amaze</p> <p><i>"The circus performers <b>amazed</b> us with their jumps and flips!"</i></p>	<p>+ing</p>	<p>Amazing</p> <p><i>"The circus performers' jumps and flips were <b>amazing!</b>"</i></p>
<p>Differ</p> <p><i>"Do our opinions <b>differ</b> over how to launch this new product?"</i></p>	<p>+ent</p>	<p>Different</p> <p><i>"Do we have <b>different</b> opinions of how to launch this new product?"</i></p>
<p>Access</p> <p><i>"Can you <b>access</b> the data files from your computer?"</i></p>	<p>+ible</p> <p><i>(The <b>ible</b> suffix is similar to the <b>able</b> suffix.)</i></p>	<p>Accessible</p> <p><i>"Are the data files <b>accessible</b> from your computer?"</i></p>
<p>Relax</p> <p><i>"Whenever I want to <b>relax</b>, I go for a walk in the woods."</i></p>	<p>+ed</p> <p><i>(Adjectives with <b>ed</b> are used to describe how you feel.)</i></p>	<p>Relaxed</p> <p><i>"Whenever I want to feel <b>relaxed</b>, I go for a walk in the woods."</i></p>
