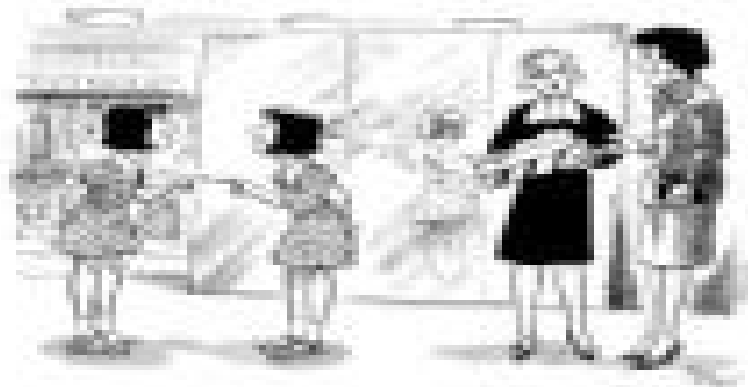


TWINS AT THE CLOTHES SHOP
