

World Cup glory at last for Kookaburras

REVENGE was sweet as the power-packed Australian men's field hockey team downed Germany 2-1 in the World Cup final overnight. It was third time lucky for the Kookaburras as they reversed the result of the 2002 and 2006 finals to take their first World Cup title in 24 years.

Man-of-the-match Luke Doerner scored the winning penalty corner 11 minutes from the end.

Eddie Edward Ockendon had put the Kookaburras ahead in the sixth minute, but Moritz Funke drew level for Germany in the 49th.

Doerner's eighth goal in the tournament made him the joint leading scorer with another penalty corner specialist Tjebbe Tuijnens of the Netherlands.

Australia, whose only previous World Cup title came way back in 1986, had lost the last two finals against Germany.

The Germans, hoping to become the first team in history to bag a hat-trick of titles to add to the Beijing Olympic gold medal two years ago, were outpaced by the speedy Australians.
