



Kinds of Adverbs



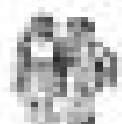
Pick out adverbs of Manner in the following sentences.

- She is not well today.

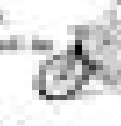


- I have read the story before.
