Uses correct grammar, punctuation, spelling, and capitalization.
2 – Approaching Grade-Level Standards	 Plot, setting, problem, solution, and point of view are not clear enough. Tells a story using few details. Work may be unorganized. May not develop plot fully. Setting is not described fully. Ending is not strong. Uses one or two sentence types through the whole story. Few ideas are connected. Confusing mistakes in grammar, punctuation, spelling, and capitalization.
