Day Three: Subject and Predicate Naming Book

Read the following carefully before you begin.

The **subject** of a sentence is what it's about. The predicate is about.

The **predicate** tells something about the subject.

In this sentence,

The **piece of candy** is circled in the left margin.

The **subject** is the piece of candy.

The **predicate** is circled in the left margin.

The **single subject** of a sentence is the main word in the subject. It is either a noun or a pronoun.

For example, in the subject **the piece of candy**, the main important word is **candy**.

The **single predicate** of a sentence is the main word in the predicate. It is a verb.

For example, in the predicate **is circled** in the left margin, the most important word is **is**.
