

## Cyberbullying – How it Works?

There are two kinds of cyberbullying: direct attacks (messages sent to you) and indirect cyberbullying (by making being attacked help someone else out), either with or without the attacker's knowledge. Before attempting to give other people advice related to the network, it would be dangerous.

### Direct Attacks

#### 1. Direct Messages/Email Messages

It may seem like sending or forwarding messages to other kids, without knowing, that they had read or not the content or forwarding messages and that can vary from:

#### 5. Indirect Bullying
