These low clouds blanket the sky with a smooth cover that looks like a sheet.

This type of cloud forms an uneven-looking blanket over the low sky.

Forming a gray sheet, these middle-level clouds blanket the sky.

These high clouds are made of ice crystals.

While the base is close to the ground, this cloud type can grow very tall. They look like heaps of clouds.

In the middle level of the sky, these lumpy clouds can form bands or piles.
