



A question of life or death

Background knowledge

All living things carry out certain life activities. They reproduce, grow, and obtain food or nutrition. They all aspire to obtain energy. Some respire by using gases from the air. All living things must excrete or get rid of the waste they produce. Living things also move. They may move to get food or run away from an enemy. Last, living things are sensitive to the environment around them. For example, some feel pain or heat.
