



Galapagos Penguin (*Spheniscus mendiculus*). Found only in the Galapagos Islands, these are the world's smallest penguins, standing sixteen to eighteen inches tall, and weighing about five pounds. They eat mostly small fish,

such as mackerel and sardines. Adults have black-black heads, backs, and flippers. The underside is white, except for a black line along the side and a scattering of feathers on the chest.
