First of all, we need to review prepositions.

A **preposition** is a part of speech that shows a relationship between a noun or pronoun and some other word in the sentence. They help show:

- Location (on, under, in)
- Time (before, after, during)
- Direction (from, toward, to)

Essential Question: What is a prepositional phrase?

A **prepositional phrase** is a group of words that begins with a preposition and ends with a noun or a pronoun.

This noun or pronoun is called the "object of the preposition."

Examples of prepositional phrases include:

- on the road
- under the tree
- before dinner
- from the forest
- to the witch's castle
