

Writing an Introduction

Read the example paragraph below:

Cats in modern times is governed by many laws. There are regulations for something as simple as how they should be treated, driving, and interacting with other cats nearby. The owner is responsible for their safety and to take care of them. The owner is responsible for their health and well-being. In some cases, the owner is responsible for their behavior. Without these laws, cats would be a much more chaotic and dangerous animal. They have their ability to talk to each other, but they also have their own way of thinking. When writing your introductory paragraph, it is best to start with a general idea introducing the topic, and then work your way down to your thesis statement.

This thesis statement is used to introduce the topic you will discuss later in your essay. For example, this thesis statement will use the following example from the book:

- 1) talking to a civilized woman: talking to see the cat's
- 2) treating each other fairly: the killing of Simon and Pigeon
- 3) thinking about the future: forgetting talking-the sign for it as they could be used
