

Native Americans

1. Introduction

This team lesson is conducted by the United States Postal Service to develop a series of postage stamps. (Students participate for the coming year to commemorate the 100th anniversary. These stamps will be sold all over the United States and have just like other collections, this collection is an important part of United history.)

2. The Task

You will work as a team of members (10 to 12 members) to create some distribution Americans. In a team of members, your group will develop some distribution Americans that will be a particular important design (part of change for your name your name and group). You will use internet resources about the Native American history, clothing, transportation, habits, religious beliefs, music, jewelry, food, and other items (Native Americans). (You will use the internet to research about your stamp. Use a short paragraph to describe what your stamp should look like and present it to the other members.)

3. The Process

Step 1: general description of the stamp

Your team will create a group of Native Americans from a region of the United States (Native Americans).

Each member of the group will be responsible for the design. You are encouraged to have a general description of the stamp.

The team members will be given one and a half (1.5) minutes to describe (the stamp) (Step 1: general description)

Your team member will create a particular type of Native American and will describe every member (describe a different type). (For example: member 1 - Native American, member 2 - Native American, member 3 - Native American, member 4 - Native American, member 5 - Native American, member 6 - Native American, member 7 - Native American, member 8 - Native American, member 9 - Native American, member 10 - Native American, member 11 - Native American, member 12 - Native American)

Step 2: creating illustrations

Each member member will be responsible for a detailed illustration (drawing, painting, etc.) which will be large enough to fill the stamp page. Each member will work with his partner and will be given 10 minutes to create the stamp.

Step 3: oral presentation of your stamp and stamp to the class (10 minutes)
