SHE	HER	HER	HERS

THEY	THEM	THEIR	THEIRS

***Subject Pronoun** – You can substitute a noun (the subject) by a subject pronoun. It always comes before a verb.

Mary is an English student.

 SHE

***Object Pronoun** – You can substitute an object of a sentence by an object pronoun. It always comes after the verb.

Lucy loves her boyfriend.

 HIM

***Possessive Adjective** – Indicate possession and refers to the subject.


Susan saw her notebook.

 Susan saw her notebook.

Peter found his pencils.

 Peter found his pencils.

***Possessive Pronoun** – Indicate possession and is used after the verb. It can substitute the combination (possessive adjective + noun)

My car is blue, your car is red.

 YOURS

His book is green, her book is pink.

 HERS
