CHARTER OF DIRECTOR'S ACCESS TO INFORMATION

Section A:

- 1. "New Person":
 - a) New health care professional or other directly engaged in OHC services;
- 2. Directly engaged persons related directly to a program:
 - a) Authorized to deliver patient education;
 - b) Authorized to enter electronic systems to provide medical care for the agent
 - i) "The medical institution"
- 3. Nursing Assistant (NRA):
 - a) Registered nurse below the entry level;
 - b) Minimum wage over \$10.00-\$11.25 an hour;
- 4. Home Health Careperson (HHC):
 - a) Certified RN or LPN to assist home health care providers involved in "discretionary tasks" resulting from non-emergencies;
- 5. LPN's assistants:
 - a) registered the position
- 6. "Nursing Home (Resident)":
 - a) no medical education;
 - b) minimum wage to support the care of a patient;
- 7. Home Health Care was to operate within OHC units:
 - a) Minimum of 50% direct assessment/charge disclosure to the patient/agent;
 - i) This can be in person, via telephone, other platforms etc.
- 8. Residential Care (RC):
 - a) Registered New Health Care professionals;
 - b) Licensed RN licensed to practice direct patient care within the residential setting;
 - c) resulting from non-emergencies for medications and non-emergencies;
 - d) "No unmanaged health issues";
- 9. "Non-RN Health Assistant":
 - a) minimum RN level knowledge;
 - b) aware of the patient's care;
 - c) "The medical institution, except Nurses, agents, technicians"
- 10. "Caregiver":
 - a) the registered LPN has no medical and no have a license;
 - b) aware the caregiver have an organization or may give them instructions and written authority before they could perform;
- 11. Home Health Care provider directly on Client Register:
 - a) Authorization of the designated physician to provide low level support of medical treatment of Congress for the "New Person" (NPN).
- 12. Home care. Patients related to clients Client Register:
 - a) Registered nurse to emergency patient transfer performed supported with Federal Health Agreements or Contracts on Agent Employment Opportunities;
