Expository writing is meant to inform, explain, describe, or define a subject. In a (1st poem the writer is telling you something--- pointing something out--- saying, 1900k at this?" or "think about this?". You are simply describing a subject.

Directions:

Start by thinking of an interesting place in your house that has an unusual assortment of things in it to write about. Here are a few suggestions:

What's on the top shelf of my closet? What's under my bed? What's in the refrigerator? What's in mysweater pocket? What's in that old box in the garage? What's in the kitchen junk drawer?

You can also come up with a topic of your own.

- Make that your opening line.
 The rest of the poem is just a list of the items you find there.
