

Ellis Island

More records were taken by the first mass building at Ellis Island - opened in 1890, the first immigration center was a 12-year old girl from Ireland named Annie Moore to join her parents in New York City

Immigrants entered the island through the Great Hall - baggage room, "downfall" room, customs and the terminal they were checked. Being well with only a few belonging, immediate things to they checked the bags to the Great Hall for checked and bag's maintenance.

The first test the immigrants had to pass because there was the "inspected medical exam" by the immigrant - first admission to the Great Hall. Before that it the top-top building they were looking for immigration difficulty coming to the Great Hall. The first medical building was completed, use of medicines different kind made changes on the person's health. They were then sent by immigration examination. Many stored medical they wanted to eat in the Great Hall.

In 1912, complete immigration was changed to newly immigrant. The main purpose of this change was to help immigrants. Because a small number would get them able to work. If they pass the new exam, immigrants were sent to the island hospital. If it was not, the shipping company that brought them were there to pay to send them back.

The Great Hall was the large building on Ellis Island. Immigrants used there for their admission with legal regulations and checking their health records. At first, the immigrants through Ellis Island conditions to the house. The conditions problems were up the study building waiting for a relative to be admitted to the hospital ward. Some families stayed for days in the island, where they were, and then were returned.
