## The Best Game EVER of Guess the Figurative Language CCSS RL.4

- . Copy the cards, laminate and cut each sheet into half, horizontally.
- · Ensure the figurative language is not cut off of the definition.
- You will then fold the cards in half so that the figurative language in context is behind the definition.
- The object of the game is to identify the figurative language within the text. The
  answer is on the back, since you folded the cards in half.
- · Hand out a card to each child.
- They have to rotate around the room or table until a signal is given to stop. (I have used music and also simply clapped my hands.)
- When that signal is given, the children stop beside a partner and take turns
  reading their text to their partner who in turn has to identify the figurative
  language use. Some cards have 2 types within the one text.
- Then, they switch their card with another person and rotate around the room again until you give the signal to stop and repeat the process.
