Why? • What/how do I like learning about the world? Why? • What/whom would I like to share information about? • Would I like to read more books about this topic? Why? • What else would I like to know about this topic? How can I find this out?
Accuracy	<p>As presented (general):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Who is the author? What qualifies the author to describe information? • What would I ask the author if I were not blind? Why? • What kind of records did the author have to be in with this information? • Does this book provide recent information? Is there a better source of information? • Does the author give different views that author says that let me know he or she is stating an opinion or a fact.
Style	<p>As presented (general):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do I understand what the author is saying? What information is the author to understand or the best to understand? Why? • Would I like to learn more about this topic? Why? • Would this book or information be different if it were written by/with another? • By reading, did it describe something that could help me outside of school? • I have read this and other book I have ever read. How is this one different? Which one do I like better? Why?
Illustrations	<p>As presented (general):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Did the author include illustrations with the book? • Are the illustrations helpful or not helpful? Why? • What/whom are pictures on the most interesting? • What would the author have done to make the information easier to understand?
The Structure	<p>How/where/when/where this book, chapter or page presented?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It gives the information in a specific order such as: in order of the times things took place or in order of how something went to down. • It just gives a list of information. • It compares something or tells how things are different. • It tells what causes something to happen and how it is like that affects something. • It tells about a problem and about a solution to the problem. • It has a main idea or topic and then gives details to support the idea or topic.
