

## Pronouns

SUBJECT PRONOUN	OBJECT PRONOUN	POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVE	POSSESSIVE PRONOUN
I	ME	MY	MINE
YOU	YOU	YOUR	YOURS
HE	HIM	HIS	HIS
SHE	HER	HER	HERS
IT	IT	ITS	ITS
WE	US	OUR	OURS
YOU	YOU	YOUR	YOURS
THEY	THEM	THEIR	THEIRS

**\*Subject Pronoun** – You can substitute a noun (the subject) by a subject pronoun. It always comes before a verb.

*Mary is an English student.*  
  
 SHE

**\*Object Pronoun** – You can substitute an object of a sentence by an object pronoun. It always comes after the verb.


*Lucy loves her boyfriend.*  
  
 HIM

**\*Possessive Adjective** – Indicate possession and refers to the subject.

*Susan saw her notebook.*  
  
 Susan saw her notebook.

*Peter found his pencils.*  
  
 Peter found his pencils.

**\*Possessive Pronoun** – Indicate possession and is used after the verb. It can substitute the combination (possessive adjective + noun)

*My car is blue, your car is red.*  
  
 YOURS

*His book is green, her book is pink.*  
  
 HERS
