

Cause and Effect

Many stories occur cause and effect to help you understand why something did happen in the story.

Let's think about the story "The Red Riding Hood".

- **Effect** (what happened): Little Red Riding Hood thought her grandma had changed.
- **Cause** (what made it happen): The wolf was dressed up as the grandmother.



Read the effects below. Write the cause for each effect and draw a line to match them.

Effects
