Learning Objectives (Content)	Key Questions and Possible Teaching Activities	Resources	Learning Outcomes (To help teacher plan at the correct level)
Pupils will learn about:- Think about how we are all different, in class and about a Sikh child, Malkit.	<ul> <li>Talk to the class about how we are all different: hair, eyes, our behaviour (loud, noisy, shy), our likes and dislikes. What do some members of the class like which others do not?</li> <li>Explain to the class that they are going to find out about another child, a boy called Malkit. Use Malkit's bat to build up a life for Malkit, making him a real little boy. Malkit is special just as children in this class are special. Unpack the items in the bag e.g. kara, turban with the children. Malkit is like the children in the class in many ways, but in other ways he is different. Malkit belongs to a Sikh family: look at some pictures of a Sikh family, home and family life.</li> <li>Start a class wall display or floor book: "Malkit and his family life", making up a life and identity for him – home, names for brother, sister, Mum and Dad. Make a large scale drawing of Malkit. Around this brainstorm words and drawings connected with Malkit and his family life.</li> </ul>		I can Talk about how I am special, that others are special and that Malkit is special to his family.
How a Sikh child is given a special name and how it is chosen.	<ul> <li>What is special to Malkit?</li> <li>Share with the children several different examples of special books: a story book, a baby record book, and a Bible. Why is each special? Use the baby book to explain that this is a record of things that have been done in the past, but it is important to its owner today. Do they have baby books? The Bible is a record of stories about God and Jesus that are very special to Christians today.</li> <li>Return the children to Malkit's bag. There is a very special book for Malkit's family too but is so special that Malkit and his family go to a very special building called the gurdwara to see it and to listen to the words from it. Malkit's special book is called the Guru Granth Sahib.</li> </ul>		Talk about how Malkit has a special name because he is a Sikh.
