Domestic violence can be viewed as communication. Domestic abuse or violence patterns manifest in the family system as a result of abusive influences by one or both partners from various relationships such as marriage, dating, family, friendship, cohabitation, divorce, or the various interrelationships between them.

Domestic violence can be a continuation of abuse. This includes physical abuse, emotional, psychological or spiritual abuse, verbal abuse and financial abuse. Physical aggression includes hitting, kicking, being pushed, restraining, choking, forcing sexual acts, etc. Emotional abuse involves forcing the partner to participate in unwanted sexual activities. Financial abuse can occur when the abusive partner deliberately keeps or uses the most money, or the partner is kept from making money, use of language such as the use of harsh words and threats. Domestic abuse includes denying the victim of sufficient money and other resources. Denial is an abusive relationship in and of itself.

Domestic violence requires a high level of communication between abusive partners because the victim may be too intimidated to say all he or she is feeling. It is abusive to pretend that you do not know the abusive partner or other persons thinking you are being covered up for other reasons. The communication of abuse is often highly possible in many systems to abuse the other partner. In 2000, communication was the most common with the partner. The victim is
