Multiplication with Arrays

When you multiply, think of the multiplication symbol as having the meaning "rows of."

The fact 3 x 6 would actually mean "3 rows of 6"

To solve this fact, draw 3 rows of 6 symbols.

 $x \times x \times x \times x$ 3 rows of 6 symbols equals 18 symbols.

 $x \times x \times x \times x$ $3 \times 6 = 18$
