

Pronouns- Personal, Reflexive, and Intensive

Personal pronouns are pronouns that change form to express person, number, and gender.

	First Person (the person speaking)	Second Person (The person spoken to)	Third Person (the person or thing spoken of)
Singular (refers to one person, place, thing, or idea)	I, me, my, mine	You, your, yours	He, him, his, she, her, hers, it, its
Plural (refers to more than one person, place, thing, or idea)	We, us, our, ours	You, your, yours	They, them, their, theirs

Pronouns can be masculine, feminine, or neuter in gender. The **masculine** pronouns **he, his** and **him** refer to males. The **feminine** pronouns **she, her,** and **hers** refer to females. The **neuter** pronouns **it** and **its** refer to thing and sometimes animals.

Bamjee is angry at **his** wife because of **her** political activities.
