What is the Sun?

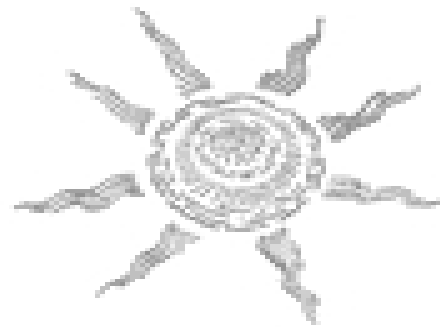
the Sun is an orange dinghy
