Coordinating Conjunctions

A compound sentence uses a coordinating conjunction.
The coordinating conjunction is between the two independent clauses, often after a comma.
Some coordinating conjunctions are for, and, nor, but, or, yet, and so.



I was thirsty. I drank some water.
↓
I was thirsty, so I drank some water.

I like berries. I don't like milk.
↓
I like berries, but I don't like milk.
