

Forming Comparative and Superlative Adjectives

Number of Syllables	Ends in	Add	Example of Comparative	Example of Superlative
1	Consonant	-er / -est	Hot - hotter	Hot - hottest
2	"y"	-e	Slow - slower	Slow - slowest
2	Consonant + vowel Consonant + Consonant Consonant + vowel	"Double the consonant if they 'eat'"	Big - bigger	Big - biggest
2	Consonant + vowel	More, most	Peaceful - more peaceful	Peaceful - most peaceful
3	"y"	Change the "y" to "i" + "-er" / "-est"	Happy - happier	Happy - happiest
2	ed, ous, (-al)	-er / -est / -est	Beautiful - more beautiful	Beautiful - most beautiful
2	Consonant + vowel	More, most	Delicious - more delicious	Delicious - most delicious

For **irregular** adjectives, you may compare them using **more** and **most** or **less** and **least**.
Example: more interesting / more beautiful / more interesting / more interesting

Example:

more interesting / more beautiful / more interesting / more interesting

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Irregular adjectives

Regular Adjective	Comparative form	Superlative form
Good	better	best
Bad	worse	worst
Far	further	furthest
Little	less	least
Many	more	most
