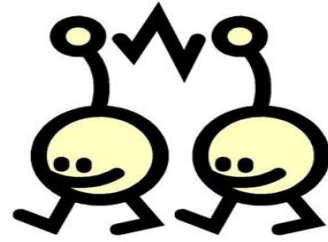


## Linking Verbs

A linking verb tells what the subject is by linking the subject to a noun or adjective in the predicate part of the sentence.

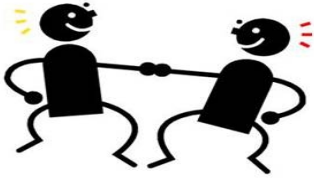
Forms of be:

am  
is  
are  
was  
were



### Making Subjects & Linking Verbs Agree:

	<u>present-tense</u>	<u>past-tense</u>
Singular Subject	is	was
Plural Subject	are	were
I	am	was



A helping verb helps the main verb. It always comes before the verb.

### Helping Verbs:

am	was	have	does	would
is	were	has	do	could
are	will	had	did	should

### Making Subjects & Helping Verbs Agree:

	<u>present-tense</u>	<u>past-tense</u>
Singular Subject	has, is, does	had, was, did
Plural Subject	have, are, do	had, were, did
I	have, am, do	had, was, did
