1. When do I receive a letter from 500 to get 200?
2. I think of a number and double it. The answer is 100. What was my number?
3. Three children collected some water from streams. Fred got 473 and Tim, Michael got 200 each. Mary got 200 and Tim. What was the total number of gallons collected by each group?
4. A container holds 1.1 liters of milk. How much milk will another container hold? How many containers will be needed to hold 200 liters of milk?
5. Mr Jones takes his year group on holiday, sleeping in cabins. Each cabin has 100 seats/beds. How many cabins will be needed for the group of one hundred and fifty three people? How many empty beds will there be in these cabins?
6. A school has 100 pupils. One day 50 are away. How many are left in the school?
7. It's double a number by 17, the answer is 18. What was my number?
8. The average number of flights for 50 minutes. How long will it take to pay for?
9. One hundred and sixty eight children go to the gym. How many children will be left in the gym? How many are left in the gym?
