2 was terribly thirsty.
3 She came upon a clay
4 pitcher that had once been
5 full of water, but now the
6 pitcher was nearly empty.
7 The parched crow tried to
8 reach the water with her
9 sharp beak, but the neck of
10 the pitcher was too narrow.
11 Again and again she tried,
12 but the pitcher was too tall
13 and the water too shallow
14 for her beak to reach even
15 one tiny drop.

16 Nearly desperate, the
17 crow stopped to think. Soon an idea came—she could make the
18 water rise! She grabbed a pebble and dropped it into the pitcher.
19 Then she took another pebble and dropped it in. Then she let fall
20 into the pitcher another pebble. One pebble at a time, the crow
21 kept on her plan. Each pebble made the water level rise a bit. And
22 each rise spurred the crow to continue.

23 At long last, the water level was high enough for the crow to
24 satisfy her thirst. And so she lived to see another day.
