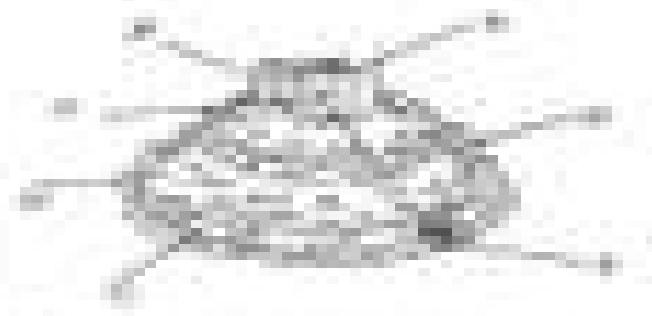


CASTLES

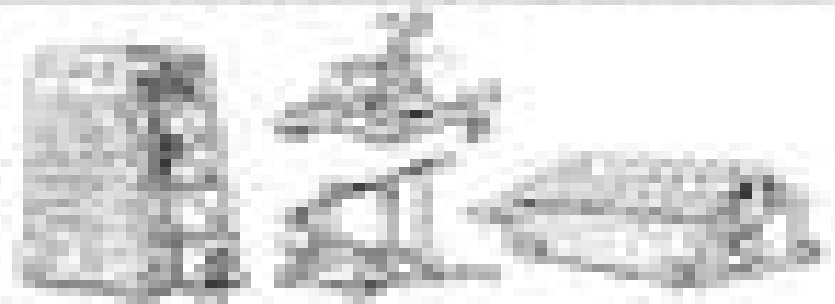
1. **What is a castle?**
 A large fortified building, often with a central tower and battlements, used for defense and as a residence for nobles or royalty.

2. **What are the main parts of a castle?**

1. Keep	The central tower or stronghold of the castle, often the last line of defense.	11. Inner bailey	The area immediately surrounding the keep, often containing other buildings.
2. Outer bailey	The area surrounding the inner bailey, often used for storage or as a secondary defense.	12. Moat	A deep ditch or water-filled trench surrounding the castle walls.
3. Drawbridge	A bridge that can be raised or lowered to control access to the castle.	13. Battlements	The crenellated top of a castle wall, used for archery or other combat.
4. Portcullis	A heavy wooden door or gate that can be closed to prevent entry.	14. Arrow slits	Narrow openings in the castle walls for archers to shoot through.
5. Moat	A deep ditch or water-filled trench surrounding the castle walls.	15. Portcullis	A heavy wooden door or gate that can be closed to prevent entry.
6. Battlements	The crenellated top of a castle wall, used for archery or other combat.	16. Arrow slits	Narrow openings in the castle walls for archers to shoot through.



1. **Keep**
 The central tower or stronghold of the castle, often the last line of defense.

2. **Outer bailey**
 The area surrounding the inner bailey, often used for storage or as a secondary defense.
