Simple Future Tense

We can use the simple future tense to talk about
(1) What we think will happen in the future
e.g. A lot of people will visit country parks next month.
You will enjoy the hike tomorrow.
(2) Plans we are making while we speak
e.g. Clare: I am tired! Will we stop soon?
Nathan: Not for a while, but I'll carry your backpack if you're tired.
