

Telling the time



What time is it?

Do you have the time, please?

► In this lesson we are going to learn how to ask questions about time.

This is a conversation between two friends Lauren and Catherine. They are going to the cinema.

Lauren: would you like to see a movie tonight?

Catherine: do we have time? I have to be home by 10.30.

Lauren: Well, I guess it's around 6.15 now. That should be plenty of time.

Catherine: All right let's look in the newspaper and see what's playing!

Lauren: ... I haven't seen any of these movies, how about this one... the Scorpion?

Catherine: Yeah it's supposed to be a good movie. How much time do we have?

Lauren: I don't know it starts at 8.30. do you have the time?

Catherine: Yeah, it's 6.20.

Lauren: That will give us almost two hours. That should be plenty of time. So let's go get tickets.

Catherine: I don't have any cash. Do you think I can pay with a credit card?

Lauren: Let's look. Mmm... it says you can, but if there's any problem I can buy your ticket!

Catherine: And I can pay you later.
