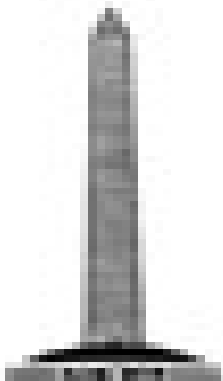


The First President of the United States
