The nose would be placed you back hand and on the hand marked that for it would stop skin from heat and cold. This would be a strong smell but more smelling incense had cleaned health and nose rags. Perfumed oil were made by mixing an incense Resin, sandal, Rose and spikenard oil. On the last also believed that Ancient Egyptians who had removed the skin sufficiently cleaning it with a base off sulphur sand which also helped them clean. Without relatives or eggs off health are known that you didn't have to work outside in this way.
