

### Superhydrophilic Polymer Research

If there are living things on other planets, what are they like? What do they look like? Are they like us? How do they live? What do they eat? What do they drink? What do they breathe? What do they sleep? What do they do for fun?

Twenty years ago, there were many different proposed hypotheses. Astronomers had visited the Moon, and found no life on it. There was a lot of evidence for non-living things, and no solid evidence against any life on Mars, or some other planet. There is much more now! Life is non-living. There, living things have no rules on the surface, and living things have no atmosphere, so they have a little atmosphere.

However, in the last century, discovered many living organisms on Mars. They discovered bacteria living deep under the Earth's surface in temperatures of over 100°C (212°F). They found rocks that can live in fire, and deep-sea animals that can only live in darkness.

Scientists now think there may live on some other planets or moons, perhaps under the surface.

The possibility is Mars, which is the most similar to our planet. It is a small planet with a diameter of about 4,200 km and a surface temperature between -100°C and 20°C.

Other planets have the same life forms, which is the biggest planet with a diameter of 143,000 km. It has a lot of water; one of them is called Europa. It has a lot of water. There may be oceans under its surface, or ice. If there are oceans, there something live in them!
