USE	The first future action will finish before the second future action.	The first future action will continue until the second future action.

EXAMPLES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I will have finished dinner by the time she calls me tonight. • By the time my teacher quizzes us tomorrow, I will have memorized all the facts. • That student will have graduated before he gets his essay back next week. • You will have already left when he gets home from his trip. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I will have been studying for two hours by the time she calls me tonight. • By the time she comes over, my kids will have been sleeping for an hour. • When I move to Vancouver next July, my best friend will have been living there for two years already. • They will have been hanging out at the bar for hours before I join them.
