

## GUSTAR AND VERBS LIKE GUSTAR

### GUSTAR

1. The verb *gustar* is the verb most commonly used in Spanish to express like and dislikes. The ending of the verb agrees with the \_\_\_\_\_ that the person likes or dislikes and not with \_\_\_\_\_. Objects must be accompanied by the \_\_\_\_\_.

*No me gusta el pollo.*  
*No le gustan las verduras.*

*Juan no le gusta.*  
*El doctor no le gusta.*

2. The indirect object pronouns *le*, \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ are used to refer to \_\_\_\_\_.

*Me gusta la música clásica.*  
*Le gustan los niños.*

*Me like classical music.*  
*You like kids.*

To add emphasis, use a prepositional phrase \_\_\_\_\_.

*A mí me gusta la música clásica.*  
*A él le gustan los niños.*

*Me like classical music.*  
*You like kids.*

To clarify *le* and *les*, use \_\_\_\_\_.

*A él le gusta la música.*  
*A ellos les gusta las cosas.*  
*A ellos les gustan los libros.*

*He likes music.*  
*They like things.*  
*You like fruit.*

3. If the subject is an \_\_\_\_\_, the \_\_\_\_\_ form of the verb *gustar* is used.

*Me gusta salir los sábados.*  
*A Felipe le gusta hacer el amor al viento.*

*I like to go out on Saturdays.*  
*John likes to make love with the wind.*
