



Title Page for Lab Reports

Since the title page is the first thing the reader sees, it should be well-balanced and attractive. It never hurts to get the reader in a good mood before being presented with your genius on the inside.

The title page of a lab report should contain: (1) the title, (2) the name of the instructor to whom the report is presented, (3) the course and section number, (4) your name, (5) your partners' names, (6) the date (due date), and (7) the location where the lab was performed.

The title should clearly stand out on the title page. Use a larger font size, bold the title, or do both to draw attention to the title.
