Incredible!



- An exclamatory sentence shows strong feeling. It is used to express astonishment or extreme emotion. It can be a word [*Stop!*], a phrase [*How strange!*], or a complete sentence. [*She's so kind!*]
- We usually use an exclamation point [!] at the end.

So & Such

- We use So & Such in sentences, to give extra emphasis to an idea.
- So + adjective** (no noun)
ex : He's so clever!
- Such + (a / O adj) noun**
ex : He's such a clever boy!

How & What

- We use How & What in phrases.
- How + adjective.**
ex : How silly!
- What + (adj) noun.**
ex : What a ridiculous idea!
