

Demonstrative pronouns

THIS is the demonstrative pronoun we use with nouns in singular. **THESE** is the plural form of "this", therefore, we use it with nouns in plural.

e.g. *This is my book.*

Are these books yours?

THAT- is used with nouns in singular;

THOSE (plural form of "that") is used with nouns in plural.

e.g. *That book is not mine.*

Those books are John's.
