Personal Essay

Knowing how to write an essay that describes your experiences, observations and opinions will prove useful when you are called upon to honor a friend, apply for entrance into a program, or deliver a passionate message. An assigned personal essay may require you to draw comparisons between your life and the life of a character in a book, recall a significant event, or explain your understanding of a situation. Use a device that freezes a second in time for your reader. Describe how you felt when you saw, heard, smelled, touched or tasted a detail in your story. Your reader will be in that moment with you, hanging onto every word, and sharing your deepest emotions. Do you see them standing to cheer you on? Do you hear their applause for your bravery and eloquence? Bravo!

Animals find themselves in a variety of environments, conflicts and dilemmas. Their response may be surprising or predictable. Research or observe an interesting animal behavior and write a personal essay that empathizes with the animal. Identify with your subject's emotions and situation by sharing a story of how you or another person felt in a similar situation. Capture your readers with a descriptive account that offers a greater understanding and appreciation for the animal kingdom.

Composing Paragraphs and Essays

This activity requires you to compose a paragraph or essay about a subject. We will explain something important or exciting in a way the reader thinks are interesting and meaningful. An essay is a group of paragraphs that work together to describe a single idea. An essay is a group of paragraphs that work together discussing a single idea. Think of the structure of either paragraphs or essays as having the same form as the capital letter "I". This form will help you successfully communicate almost anything.

Topic Sentence or Paragraph (Thesis Statement)

Tell your reader what your subject is and what you will say about it.

1st point is related to the topic.

Any ideas or supporting details related to the 1st point may be continued in additional sentences or paragraphs.

2nd point is related to the topic.

Any ideas or supporting details related to the 2nd point....

3rd point is related to the topic.

Any ideas or supporting details related to the 3rd point....

And so on....

Concluding Sentence or Paragraph

Bring the reader to a logical position based on what you told them.
