Making Inferences

The author doesn't always tell everything about what is happening in a story. Instead, you as the reader must make inferences to figure out what is going on. You don't have your life experiences and lots of "prior knowledge" helping you draw certain types of inferences.

When you make an inference, you add what you already know to what the author tells you. The reader infersences the author's unknown when interpreting in a story. Many inferences can be made from what you know. These inferences can be logical and reasonable, while some are fantastical and unreasonable. This will lead to our common sense.

2. What about what you already know, and
3. Make an inference based on your knowledge
