To show an affixated compound in Spanish, we simply take the two stems of a word, and drop the "o".

Example: **hombre** → **hombra** → drop "o" → **hombra** + **Spanish**
capón → **capona** → drop "o" → **capona** + **Span**
huevo → **hueva** → drop "o" → **hueva** + **Span**
